RESOLUTION OF THE MIFFLIN COUNTY COMMISSIONERS (MCC) ON BEHALF OF THE BROWN TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS (BTS)

APPROVING BUDGET REVISIONS TO THE FFY 2018 CDBG PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the BTS and the Mifflin County Commissioners (MCC) on behalf of the BTS funded the single-family housing rehabilitation project in FFY 2018 in the amount of \$7,910.00;

WHEREAS, the BTS and the MCC on behalf of the BTS funded the ADA Restroom Improvements Mifflin County Youth Park project in FFY 2018, in the amount of \$3,915.00;

WHEREAS, the BTS and the MCC on behalf of the BTS are desirous of reducing the FFY 2018 ADA Restroom Improvements Mifflin County Youth Park project and increasing the single-family, housing rehabilitation project in the amount of \$1,089.60;

WHEREAS, it is the requirement of the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development (PA-DCED), to revise the Township's 2018 program funding budgets, so as to complete the following actions:

- 1. Reduce the FFY 2018 ADA Restroom Improvements Mifflin County Youth Park project in the amount of \$1,089.60.
- 2. Increase the FFY 2018 Single-family, housing rehabilitation project in the amount of \$1,089.60.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the MCC on behalf of the BTS as follows:

- 1. That the program budget revisions affecting the Township's 2018 program budgets are approved through the adoption of this resolution.
- 2. The BTS approved a resolution for the aforementioned actions at their May 3, 2021 public meeting.
- 3. That the Mifflin County Planning and Development Department is authorized to complete and submit said revision request and required documentation to the (PA- DCED) for review and approval.

Chastity Fultz spoke and said that we need a little bit for money for a single family housing rehabilitation project, and the Youth Park has decided to for-go the use of CDBG funds for their restroom improvements at the Mifflin County Youth Park. We are moving the amount needed from the youth park project budget to the single family rehabilitation project.

Motion was made by Commissioner Postal to be approved. Commissioner Kodish seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

I. Sub-recipient agreement with Wayne Township for the Wayne Township Infrastructure Improvement Project

Chastity Fultz spoke and said we need to put this into place and get it ready to bid in early June. The project will be completed this year.

Motion was made by Commissioner Postal to be approved. Commissioner Kodish seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

J. Resolution No. 5 of 2021 supporting Downtown Lewistown Inc. for a five year period at \$5,000 per year (2021 through 2025)

WHEREAS, Downtown Lewistown, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as the "Organization") is applying to the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development to maintain its certification under the Keystone Communities Program (hereinafter referred to as the "Program"); and
